- Hike Description
- Short hikes into restoration and forested areas over uneven ground with occasional waist high brush and small diameter downed trees. 10%-15% grade, some wetland travel possible.
- A short auto tour of the urbanized Shelton Prairie can be done at the end of the Bear Grass tour for those interested. This could extend the time by an hour or so, not later than 1600.
- Any special requirements: Hiking boots or sturdy walking shoes. Bring lunch, drinking water, and dress for appropriate weather conditions.

- George Adams Hatchery is located 7 miles north of Shelton on Hwy 101 to the intersection with West Skokomish Valley Rd. Heading North from Shelton, turn left (West) on W. Skokomish Valley Rd and meet in the parking lot 50 meters on the right.
- Those heading South on Hwy 101 from Hoodspport or Hwy 106 take the second right hand road after crossing the Skokomish River Bridge. This is W. Skokomish Valley Rd and we'll meet in the parking lot 50 meters on the right.
